WORLD-BUILDING




Magic that doubles as law and logistics. Societies where the supernatural has brutal, logical socioeconomic consequences.

# For the love of strict rules and societal rot.

## Red City by Marie Lu

-  **Prose Style:** Cinematic and sharp, moving effortlessly between quiet childhood intimacy and the brutal, fast-paced reality of gang warfare.
-  **Thematic Depth:** A nuanced look at ambition, poverty, and addiction. It asks what pieces of your soul you are willing to tear away to achieve absolute perfection.
-  **World-Building:** Los Angeles reimaged through an alchemical mafia. Magic isn't free—every transmutation literally hollows out the practitioner's essence.

## A Forbidden Alchemy by Stacey McEwan

-  **Prose Style:** Gritty, grounded, and intensely atmospheric. It carries a heavy, industrial tension reminiscent of a magical 1920s syndicate.

**Thematic Depth:** A furious critique of how revered institutions willingly consume the individual to preserve their own historical reputations.





**World-Building:** A deeply unsettling magical school setting where the educators literally devour their apocalyptically powered students.

## Bury Our Bones in the Midnight Soil by V.E. Schwab


 **Prose Style:** Hauntingly poetic and razor-sharp. The narrative voice feels like a slow, deliberate tightening of a wire.

## Innamorata by Ava Reid




 **Prose Style:** Lush, somatic, and deeply unsettling. The writing forces you to feel the physical weight, rot, and decay of the environment.

 **Thematic Depth:** An exploration of the decadence of nobility, focusing heavily on how history and power rot from the inside out.




 **World-Building:** Features a deeply disturbing, anatomically focused necromancy system entirely grounded in the horrific reality of the body.
